- Connect and Communicate: communication occurs via broadcast email, webinars, videos, phone, <u>blog posts</u>, dashboard announcements (in Trail Life Connect), <u>Twitter</u>, Facebook (Troop and Area pages, <u>main page</u>, <u>forum</u> group, Point Man group), websites (<u>TLUSA main site</u>, <u>TLUSA store</u>), Trail Life Connect Resources, and in person at <u>events</u> like the Parent and Leader Convention, Trail Leader Trainings, Trail Ready Learner Conferences (TRLC), and Point Man and Area Team Trainings.
- Participate in a TLUSA <u>Troop Fast Start Training</u>, hopefully in person led by an experience direct-contact Troop Leader in an online session led by a qualified Area Team member.
- Determine with your mentor/coach what support role best suits your skill set and schedule).
- Know what a Thriving Area is, and seek to make yours one: <u>Area Trail Tracks</u>
